
#### Life in Motion (2014) by Misty Copeland:






# **Related Themes to Explore**

While the film talks about the coming-of-age from a specific reference point, (female, French, lower socio-economic circumstance), this growth, insight, and explorative notion is widely relevant and can be explored in many different ways. Here are some examples of broader topics that you could explore in the classroom:

#### Coming-of-Age Around the World

Growing up is hard enough, let alone growing where there is persistent lack of education, resources, and opportunities. Some adolescents and teens face dramatically different challenges as they come of age in this time in the world.

#### Questions to think about:

- What are the socio-cultural factors that shaped, or were at play in Marieme, the main character's life? How did those factors influence or complicate her choices?
- [Research Opportunity] Compare and contrast elements of growing up in the United States and what you perceive growing up in France [or another select part of the world] might be like. What are the similarities and differences?
- [Research Opportunity] Which are some of the most and least free countries around the world?
- Does peer pressure look or feel different in other parts of the world? What types of pressures do some teenagers face around the world that teens may not face in the US?

#### Identity

The film explores the main character's changing outward expression of style and identity, at points blurring the lines of feminine and masculine style and stereotype, as well as pushing boundaries of race and class. Contemporary culture is also exploring, at times resisting, and/or challenging stereotypes or ideals of what it means to be feminine or masculine, of a certain race or ethnicity, or from a certain economic class.

#### Questions to think about:

- In what ways is US society reexamining gender identity? What examples are out there in the media, in the community, in school?
- What are some of the historical references where we can trace these notions of specific gender or socio-economic architypes and roles? Who decides these roles?
- How is society re-envisioning traditional stereotypes and roles based on gender, race, and/or class? Where is society in conflict?
- What are examples of gender socialization? Socio-economic socialization? Where do these notions, expectations, understandings, or assumptions, come from in our society?
